## The Will of God

The phrase “the will of God” slips too easily off the lips of some who are trying to be helpful. We must break with the idea that every thing that happens is “the will of God.” To attribute suffering and disease and death and war and every other manner of evil to God is, as I see it, a form of blasphemy. In the 18<sup>th</sup> chapter of Matthew, Jesus says, “It is not the will of your Father which is in heaven that one of these little ones should perish.” Who of us could say that God would ever will the death of a child?

In his little book *The Will of God*, Leslie Weatherhead helps us to understand that God’s will can be better understood if it is broken into three parts – God’s intentional will, God’s circumstantial will, and God’s ultimate will. Weatherhead insists that we paint ourselves into a corner when we use the phrase “the will of God” to cover all three dimensions of God’s will, and he invites his readers to look at the life of Jesus asking the question: “What was God’s will for Jesus’ life?”

First, scripture reveals that God’s desire was for Jesus to be followed. It was God’s **intention** that people accept Jesus, listen to his words and repent of their sins.

**Circumstances**, however, brought about by the evil and sin of men and women compelled Christ to either be obedient to God and die or be unfaithful and turn away. It was in those **circumstances** that the cross became God’s will for Jesus . . . but only in those **circumstances** – which were themselves the fruit of evil. In the situation in which Christ found himself any other way out would not have been in keeping with God’s will. “Nevertheless,” said Jesus, “not what I will, but as thou wilt.”

Finally, there is the **ultimate** will of God . . . which means that even though men and women reject the love of God in Christ, God’s **ultimate** will is going to be accomplished. In spite of my sins and your sins, in spite of the wickedness in the World God’s love will win out. Not anything of value will be lost from God. This is the meaning of the **ultimate** will of God, and it is quite different from saying that everything that happens has occurred because God wanted it to happen.

Understanding God’s will is complex. It is more than complex. God’s will is a mystery . . . a mystery that can draw us closer into the loving arms of One whose will for us is mercy and grace – both now and in life everlasting.

This summer, on Friday, June 15, Presbyterians from Central Illinois will meet together at O'Brien field in Peoria to cheer on the Peoria Chiefs!

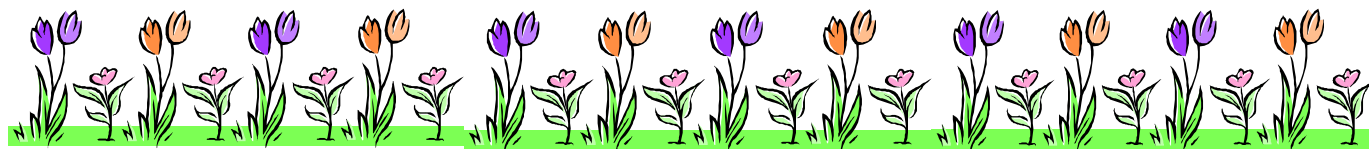
Tickets cost \$7.00 and can be purchased through the church. This will be a fun outing for our church family and friends.

Our congregation has the opportunity to work with the New Mission Church of God in an outreach program to women in need called Priscilla's Lost and Found, Inc. LaVern McNeese, wife of the pastor, has invited women of our church to an informational brunch on March 31, 2007 to find out more about this service. This is a new effort on their part so we would all be learning together. Attendance at the brunch would not make one obligated to volunteer but it is a chance to get to know each other better.

The service is in an exploration stage. Volunteers would be "spiritual connectors" to women in need who could become "spiritual advisees." The March 31 brunch is just for information concerning how this would be done, and it will be a good time to get acquainted with women from New Mission Church. ### **Sudan Advocacy Forum**

I want to quote Bono, the internationally known singer, who goes to World Bank conferences and raises millions of dollars for poor countries. In reference to the meaning of equality, he writes, "What is happening in Africa mocks our pieties, doubts our concern, and questions our commitment to that whole concept. Because if we're honest there's no way we could conclude that such mass death day after day would ever be allowed to happen anywhere else."

Last September our congregation heard Rev. Heidi McGuinness preach about her humanitarian work in Darfur, Sudan, and a generous offering was given to her for the work of her organization, Christian Solidarity International. Since then, by a unanimous vote, the Session approved the action of the Mission Committee to hang a banner at the front of our church to raise awareness of the suffering of the people of Darfur..It will be a reminder to us and the community of our obligation as moral people to act on their behalf. They are "the least of these" of whom Jesus speaks.

Each of us can be in an advocacy network. The Sudan Advocacy Forum of which the Presbyterian Church (USA) is a part asks its supporters to:

PRAY - that the needs of the persecuted will be met; for the redemption of persecutors; for guidance for peace negotiations; for people giving humanitarian relief.

ACT - communicate with U.S. government officials and the United Nations to monitor violations of human rights and the adherence to provisions of the shaky peace agreement already agreed to.

GIVE - through experienced agencies that have laid the proper groundwork, such as our own PC(USA) worldwide ministries. Make the check out to PC(USA), write on the memo line "Sudan DR000034". Mail to: Presbyterian Church (USA), Individual Remittance Processing, P.O. Box 6437000, Pittsburgh, PA. 15264-3700.

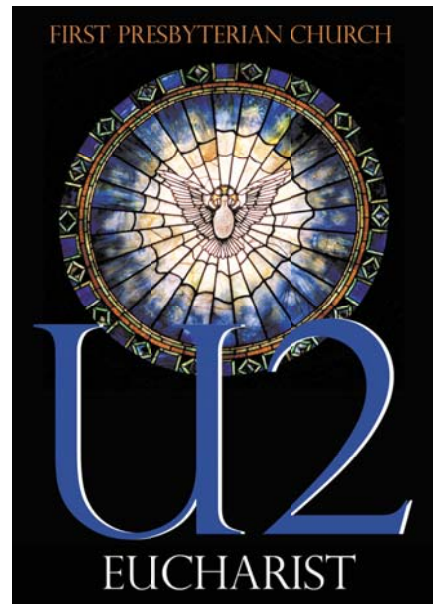

The workshop wasn’t nearly what I expected, but nonetheless, I did walk out with some new understanding of what it takes to present a children’s sermon. And, I had fun while learning.

A workshop I found to be helpful was “retooling” the Christian education committee. Time spent in this workshop was well spent! I have come back with loads of knowledge on what the Christian Nurture committee should be doing...and have found that we have a lot of work to do. I hope that our Christian Nurture committee can become something of greatness and lead our church into the future.

The unexpected surprise of the conference was the trip to the Presbyterian Historical Society, located in the historical district of Philly. Our tour guide was full of passion, not only about preserving history, but passionate about being part of a great faith. This tour provided many historical artifacts and pictures that are important to the Presbyterian history.
